University of Lincoln International Scholarships Terms and Conditions – 2025/26 Academic Year

The terms and conditions set out in this document relate to the awarding of University of Lincoln International Scholarships in respect of the 2025/26 academic year.

For the purposes of this document, the following definitions shall apply:

Definition of 'Programme of Study':

A University of Lincoln;

- Undergraduate Programme
- Postgraduate Taught Programme

Definition of 'Country or Regional Scholarships':

The following University of Lincoln International Scholarships will collectively be referred to as 'Country or Regional Scholarships';

- Africa Scholarship
- China Scholarship
- European Union/EEA Scholarship
- Egypt Scholarship
- South Asia Scholarship
- South East Asia Scholarship
- Turkey Scholarship
- USA Scholarship

General Terms and Conditions applicable to all University of Lincoln International Scholarships

Eligibility

- 1.1. To be eligible to receive a University of Lincoln International Scholarship, students must have an offer of a place on a Programme of Study which begins in September 2025, or January 2026, unless otherwise stated.
- 1.2. Students must be classified for tuition fee purposes as an overseas fee payer on the University's Student Information System, to be eligible to receive a University of Lincoln International Scholarship.
- 1.3. University of Lincoln International Scholarships will only be awarded to students who have an offer of a place on a full-time Programme of Study at a University of Lincoln campus within the UK.
- 1.4. Students will automatically be considered for a University of Lincoln International Scholarship after they have submitted their application to study at the University. The exception to this is the Global Leaders Scholarship and the Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship; students who wish to be considered for the above scholarships must submit the relevant application form prior to the applicable deadline specified in clause 12.3 and 14.3 respectively.
- 1.5. Students must complete the domicile section in their application to study at the University of Lincoln, to be eligible to be considered for a University of Lincoln International Scholarship.
- 1.6. University of Lincoln International Scholarships are not valid in conjunction with each other; only one University of Lincoln International Scholarship per Programme of Study will be applied.
- 1.7. Students who have been awarded sponsorship from an organisation, or government body, for the full amount of their tuition fees will not be eligible to receive a University of Lincoln International Scholarship, except in instances where the University of Lincoln has a formal agreement in place with the sponsor.
- 1.8. Students who are in receipt of a study loan from a government body or private organisation will be eligible to receive a University of Lincoln International Scholarship, subject to meeting the relevant scholarship criteria.
- 1.10. Students who are repeating a year of their Programme of Study will not be eligible to receive a University of Lincoln International Scholarship.
- 1.11. Students studying a two-year postgraduate taught programme will only be entitled to receive a Country or Regional Scholarship, or the Global Leaders Scholarship, in the first year of their studies.

Disclaimer

- 2.1. University of Lincoln International Scholarships are awarded as tuition fee discounts and are non-transferable.
- 2.2. The University of Lincoln reserves the right to refuse the award of a scholarship if a student's qualification has not been obtained from an Ecctis recognised institution.
- 2.3. The University of Lincoln reserves the right to withdraw a University of Lincoln International Scholarship if a student is subsequently found to be ineligible after an award has been made.

- 2.4. The University of Lincoln reserves the right to amend the provision of University of Lincoln International Scholarships at any point and without notice.
- 2.5. All University of Lincoln International Scholarship decisions made by the University of Lincoln are final.

The Awarding of Scholarships

Global Undergraduate Scholarship

- 3.1. The Global Undergraduate Scholarship is worth £2,000 and will be deducted, subject to clause 3.2, from tuition fees for each full-time year of study on an Undergraduate Programme at the University. For the avoidance of doubt, students taking part in a work placement year, or year-long study abroad placement, will not be eligible to receive the Global Undergraduate Scholarship for that period.
- 3.2. To be eligible to receive the Global Undergraduate Scholarship, students must have submitted their application to study at the University of Lincoln prior to the deadline of Sunday 1 June 2025.

Africa Scholarship

- 4.1. To be eligible to receive the Africa Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) Africa, with the exception of Egypt, at the time of applying to the University. Please see clause 6.1 for details regarding scholarship eligibility for students who are nationals of, or have permanent residence in Egypt.
- 4.2. The Africa Scholarship will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 4.3. A £5,000 Africa Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification as determined by the University
- 4.4. A £4,000 Africa Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained the equivalent of a 2:2 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification as determined by the University

China Scholarship

- 5.1. To be eligible to receive the China Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) mainland China at the time of applying to the University.
- 5.2. The China Scholarship will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.

- 5.3. A £5,000 China Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification as determined by the University
- 5.4. A £4,000 China Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained the equivalent of a 2:2 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification as determined by the University

Egypt Scholarship

- 6.1. To be eligible to receive the Egypt Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) Egypt at the time of applying to the University.
- 6.2. The Egypt Scholarship will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 6.3. A £5,000 Egypt Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification as determined by the University
- 6.4. A £4,000 Egypt Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained the equivalent of a 2:2 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification as determined by the University

European Union/EEA Scholarship

- 7.1. To be eligible to receive the European Union/EEA Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) one of the following countries at the time of applying to the University: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, or Sweden.
- 7.2. The European Union/EEA Scholarship is worth £5,000 and will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 7.3. The scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification as determined by the University

South Asia Scholarship

- 8.1. To be eligible to receive the South Asia Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) one of the following countries at the time of applying to the University: Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan, or Sri Lanka.
- 8.2. The South Asia Scholarship will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 8.3. A £3,000 South Asia Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification
- 8.4. A £1,000 South Asia Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained the equivalent of a 2:2 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification

South East Asia Scholarship

- 9.1. To be eligible to receive the South East Asia Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) one of the following countries at the time of applying to the University: Brunei, Cambodia, East Timor, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, or Vietnam.
- 9.2 The South Asia Scholarship will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 9.3. A £5,000 South East Asia Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification
- 9.4. A £4,000 South East Asia Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained the equivalent of a 2:2 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification

Turkey Scholarship

- 10.1. To be eligible to receive the Turkey Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) Turkey at the time of applying to the University.
- 10.2. The Turkey Scholarship will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.

- 10.3. A £5,000 Turkey Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification
- 10.4. A £4,000 Turkey Scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained the equivalent of a 2:2 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification

USA Scholarship

- 11.1. To be eligible to receive the USA Scholarship, students must be a national of (or have permanent residence in) the United States of America at the time of applying to the University.
- 11.2. The USA Scholarship is worth £5,000 and will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 11.3. The scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have:
 - a) completed a Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution and have obtained at least the equivalent of a 2:1 classification **or**
 - b) completed a Pre-Master's degree, or a qualification equivalent to a UK Master's degree, with a comparable classification

Global Leaders Scholarship

- 12.1. The Global Leaders Scholarship is worth 50% of tuition fees for one year of study at the University. For the avoidance of doubt, students studying a Programme of Study with a duration of two or more years will only be entitled to receive the scholarship during the first year of enrolment at the University.
- 12.2. To be eligible to apply for the Global Leaders Scholarship, students must have a conditional offer or unconditional offer of a place on an Undergraduate Programme, or Postgraduate Taught Programme, commencing at the University in the 2025/26 academic year.
- 12.3. The Global Leaders Scholarship is competitive. In order to be considered for the scholarship, students must submit a University of Lincoln Global Leaders Scholarship Application form prior to one of the deadlines listed below:

For a Programme of Study commencing in September 2025:

Round One: Friday 10 January Round Two: Friday 7 March Round Three: Friday 6 June

For a Programme of Study commencing in January 2026:

Round One: Friday 3 October Round Two: Friday 7 November

- 12.4. University of Lincoln Global Leaders Scholarship Application forms received after the deadline will be considered at the next applicable application round. Applications received after the final deadline will not be considered.
- 12.5. Students intending to join an Undergraduate Degree are expected to achieve a minimum of 128 UCAS points (or an equivalent) in their High School studies. Students who are in the process of completing their studies at the time of submitting a University of Lincoln Global Leaders Scholarship Application form will need to include a copy of their most recent academic transcripts as part of their application.
- 12.6. Students intending to join a Postgraduate Taught Programme must have obtained a minimum of a 2.1 classification or higher (or its equivalent) in their undergraduate degree. Students who are in the process of finishing their studies at the time of submitting a University of Lincoln Global Leaders Scholarship Application form will need to provide a copy of their most recent academic transcript as part of their application.
- 12.7. Students who have been awarded a Global Leaders Scholarship must choose to accept or decline the scholarship award, and pay a CAS deposit (where applicable), by the date specified in the award confirmation email. The University reserves the right to withdraw the offer of a Global Leaders Scholarship if the acceptance and/or CAS deposit deadline has not been met.
- 12.8. The University endeavours to notify Global Leaders Scholarship applicants of a scholarship decision, via email, within 10 working days following the applicable round closing date.

International Alumni Scholarship

- 13.1. The International Alumni Scholarship is worth £2,000 and will be applied as a tuition fee discount against the cost of the first year of a Postgraduate Taught Programme.
- 13.2. The scholarship will automatically be awarded to eligible students who have successfully completed a University of Lincoln Programme of Study.

Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship

- 14.1. The Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship is worth 100% of tuition fees for one year of study on an Undergraduate Programme. For the avoidance of doubt, students studying an Undergraduate Programme with a duration of two or more years will only be entitled to receive the scholarship during the first year of their enrolment at the University.
- 14.2. To be eligible to apply for the Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship, students must have previously studied at an overseas higher education provider which has a partnership with the University of Lincoln. Students must also be in receipt of a conditional or unconditional offer of a place, through advanced entry, on an Undergraduate Programme which commences at the University of Lincoln in September 2025.
- 14.3. In order to be considered for the scholarship, students must submit a University of Lincoln Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship Application form before the deadline of Sunday 1 June 2025. Applications received after the deadline will not be considered.
- 14.4. To be eligible to receive the scholarship, students must have achieved a first-class (or an equivalent grade) in their undergraduate studies. Students who are in the process of finishing their studies at the time of submitting a University of Lincoln Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship Application form will need to provide a copy of their most recent academic transcript as part of their application.

- 14.5. In exceptional circumstances, scholarship applicants with a 2.1 or equivalent may be considered on a case-by-case basis, where notable professional achievement is evidenced within the University of Lincoln Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship Application form.
- 14.6. Students who have been awarded a Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship must choose to accept or decline the scholarship award, and pay a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) deposit (where applicable), by the date specified in the award confirmation email. The University reserves the right to withdraw the offer of a Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship if the acceptance and/or CAS deposit deadline has not been met.
- 14.7. The University endeavours to notify Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship applicants of a scholarship decision, via email, within 10 working days following the application deadline.
