Research With Impact

Through our research we are striving to change society for the better. Working with regional, national, and international partners, our staff and students are engaged in ground-breaking studies that are challenging the status quo.

Whether improving productivity in the food supply chain, developing more effective cancer treatments, or addressing causes and drivers of climate variations, our research institutes and centres are home to pioneering new studies which are helping to change the world.

Our research is making a difference. Results from the most recent Research Excellence Framework (REF), which is a system for measuring research excellence in higher education institutions in the UK, revealed that more than three quarters (79 per cent) of the University of Lincoln's research was

judged to be internationally excellent or world-leading.

At Lincoln, you are able to learn from leading academics many of whom are well known in their respective fields for their innovative research and distinctive responses to global issues.



Meet Some of Our Academics



Prof Mini Rai

With a passion for space engineering and technology, Professor Rai's research interests centre around the development of innovative robotic systems for space missions, and application of cross-sector technology transfers in terrestrial industries.

Prof Daniel Mills

Professor Mills is a world-renowned authority on the human-animal bond. His research focuses on the assessment of emotion in non-human animals, and how this understanding can be applied to human animal relationships, problem behaviour in animals, and improving the performance of working animals.



Dr Jose Gonzalez-Rodriguez

Dr Gonzalez-Rodriguez is an analytical chemist specialising in molecular analysis from an environmental, forensic, and biological perspective. His research has contributed to innovative new ways to purify water, improve materials used in gas masks, and develop more effective gathering of rare metals used in electronics.

A City Steeped in History

Lincoln is regarded as one of England's great historic cities and we're proud to call it our home.

From its Roman ruins and an almost 1,000-year-old castle, to its medieval cathedral which was once the tallest building in the world, Lincoln is a place steeped in history. As one of the top three most affordable university cities in the UK¹, it's also a fantastic place to be a student.

There's lots to see and do within walking distance of our city-centre campus. Whether it be exploring storied cobbled streets, taking up a new sport, or watching a music gig at one of the city's live entertainment venues, Lincoln has so much to offer.

History and Heritage

Steep Hill is the gateway to Lincoln's historic Cathedral Quarter and Bailgate area, where character-filled streets are lined with quirky shops and places to eat.

The area is home to Lincoln Cathedral, one of Europe's most celebrated medieval buildings and the location of our graduation ceremonies. At the nearby Lincoln Castle, you can walk in the footsteps of kings and see one of only four surviving originals of the 1215 Magna Carta.

Immerse Yourself in Culture

There's always plenty going on at the many entertainment venues across the city, from comedy clubs and theatre performances, to live music and evening classes. Lincoln is also home to several popular quiz nights and a number of gaming bars, offering a variety of arcade and social experiences.



Sports and Keeping Fit

Lincoln is a great place to enjoy sports and stay active. The city is home to a wide range of sports and leisure facilities, including gyms, swimming pools, and cycle routes. If you're looking for a unique experience, consider trying indoor go-karting, axe-throwing, or virtual golf.

You could also watch one of our local sports teams in action, such as Lincoln City Football Club (the Imps), or catch one of the many live sporting events that take place in and around the city.

The Great Outdoors

You don't have to go far to experience the great outdoors. Lincoln is surrounded by picturesque countryside

and is home to Green Flag award-winning parks, including the Arboretum, Boultham Park, and Hartsholme Country Park.

The wider county is also home to some of the UK's cleanest and safest beaches, including Mablethorpe and Sutton on Sea, alongside Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty, such as the Lincolnshire Wolds.

Life on Campus

Located in the centre of the city of Lincoln, our vibrant campus is big enough to have almost everything you could need throughout your studies, yet close-knit enough to feel like you're part of a community.

We have invested around £400 million over the past two decades to create an environment that is designed around the needs of our students. From our centrally located student wellbeing hub and medical centre, to a range of sports and fitness facilities, and social spaces,

our Brayford Pool campus is home to much more than just lecture halls.

Our buildings provide innovative and flexible learning spaces. No matter which course you choose, we aim to provide you with facilities that will help you

to prepare for your future career, including scientific laboratories, state-of-the-art clinical suites, specialist arts studios, and advanced research facilities.



Study Spaces

There are a variety of study spaces you can access across campus, including the Great Central Warehouse Library. With 750,000 print and electronic books, 260,000 journals, databases, and specialist collections, the library is a hub for individual and collaborative work.

Alongside helping you to access academic materials, our experienced Library Team also provide a wide range of practical support for students' learning and development, with drop-in sessions, tutorials, workshops, and one-to-one appointments.

Socialising and Keeping Fit

Life on campus is not all about studying. Whether grabbing a coffee at The Swan pub or Towers bar, enjoying a show at the Lincoln Arts Centre, or watching a gig at The Engine Shed - the region's largest live music and entertainment venue - there's plenty of activities and amenities for you to enjoy when you are taking a break from the books.

Fitness enthusiasts can take advantage of our on-campus Sports Centre, complete with a well-equipped gym, fitness classes, and facilities like five-a-side football pitches, hockey

pitches, squash courts, and basketball courts. There's also a number of sports clubs and societies that you can get involved in through Lincoln Students' Union.

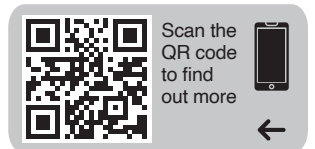


Culture On Campus

A Place to Call Home

Where you live whilst at university can play a big part in your overall student experience. It's not just about a place to stay, it's about creating memories, forming friendships, and feeling like you belong.

All of our accommodation at the University of Lincoln is either on campus or nearby. So whether you are heading to a lecture, needing to use the library, or catching up with friends in the city centre, it's all within walking distance.

Our halls of residence include Cygnet Wharf, Lincoln Courts, St Marks, 179 High Street, Viking House, and Valentine Court. Each one has its own character and is designed to create a sense of community to help you feel at home.

No matter which residence you choose, you'll have your own bedroom which includes furniture such as a bed, desk, wardrobe and storage. The majority of our accommodation is en suite too, except for select rooms in Lincoln Courts.

Affordable Living

We understand that going to university is a big investment and to help support as many students as possible, we offer a range of affordable accommodation options with prices starting from £99 per week*.

A deposit or guarantor is not required and there is the option to pay through instalments to help you manage your budget.

The price of our accommodation includes:

- › Utility bills
- › WiFi
- › Personal possessions insurance
- › Access to the University's on-campus gym and fitness classes
- › On-site maintenance
- › Staffed receptions, including a space for collecting post and parcels

Help When You Need It

Our accommodation is managed by our helpful Accommodation Services Team who are available to support you throughout your time living in our residences.

You'll also be supported by our dedicated Residence Life Team who run a variety of events throughout the year such as games nights, movie nights, and study sessions, giving you the chance to meet new people.

A Sustainable Future

At Lincoln, we recognise that we have a responsibility to reduce our environmental impact and to provide a sustainable future for generations to come.

With the world facing an unprecedented rise in global temperatures, we have been developing a range of approaches to environmental sustainability that aim to reduce any negative effect that our operations may have, and to offer solutions to these challenges through our teaching and research.

Our Ambitions

Our wider sustainability strategy includes three key strands, which categorise the multitude of work taking place across the University to tackle the climate and ecological emergency. These are: Sustainable Campus; Sustainable Culture; and Collaboration for Change.

We have committed to achieving net-zero emissions by 2040 – with a 60 per cent reduction in carbon emissions by 2030, and are dedicated to contributing towards all 17 of the United Nations’ Sustainable Development Goals.

We aim to be recognised for our local and global impact in the transition to net zero, and are proud to be ranked as a Gold Tier University in the 2023 Uswitch Green Universities Report – an annual study that assesses which universities are leading the way in green initiatives and renewable energy.



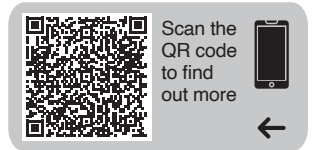
Sustainability at Lincoln

Our commitment to a sustainable future is reflected in the fabric of our campus. As an example, our Ross Lucas Medical Sciences Building features solar panels and a ‘living wall’, which helps to insulate the building and reduce energy consumption.

Research at Lincoln is firmly focused on the net-zero agenda, and we strive to inform policy that shapes industry practice and

accelerates the transition to a low-carbon future. Net-zero thinking is also embedded in our teaching, with many of our courses including modules that focus on creating sustainable solutions for real-world challenges.

There are a variety of environmental projects to get involved in across the University, including our Climate Action Festival, the edible campus project, and the Hedgehog Friendly Campus initiative.





Here to Support You Every Step of the Way

We understand that leaving home and starting university is a big step, but it's important to know that you're not alone and that we're here to support you.

The University of Lincoln offers a whole host of support services from mental health and expert advice in money matters, to guidance in academic writing and preparing for your first graduate job interview. Our Student Support Centre brings many of these services together, providing a central point of contact that can link you with the appropriate team.

Health and Wellbeing

We know that it's not possible for everyone to travel home to access healthcare, which is why we have an on-campus medical centre where you can make an appointment to see a local doctor (known as a 'GP' or General Practitioner). The medical centre is located at the heart of our Brayford Pool campus, meaning you are never far from getting the help you need.

You can also seek specialist advice from our professionally trained advisors in the University's Student Wellbeing Centre. Our experienced advisors are available to support students with mental health, disabilities, specific learning differences, long-standing conditions, distressing life events, and much more. They can also help to make sure that reasonable adjustments are made to your studies if required.

Academic Support

When you join us you will be assigned a personal tutor. They can help you settle into student life and be a regular point of contact for queries you may have about studying, your academic progress, or any personal support you may need.

The University of Lincoln's International College also provides a range of helpful services, including workshops, one-to-one sessions, and in-session courses to support students for whom English is an additional language. Some examples of the courses available include English for dissertation writing, culture and conversation, and presentation skills.

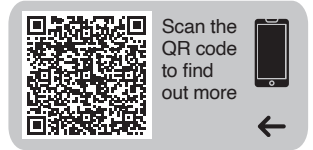
Student Advice Team

Degree Preparation Programmes

We understand that studying in the UK might be a little different to what it is like in your home country. Our dedicated International College offers a wide range of programmes and services to help you prepare for that transition in a supportive and friendly environment.

Preparing You to Succeed

If you are unable to meet the entrance requirements to study a University of Lincoln undergraduate or postgraduate degree, you may be eligible to enrol onto a degree preparation programme. These are specially designed programmes to help international students to develop the English language and academic study skills, and subject-specific knowledge required for degree-level study.

Our degree preparation programmes include the International Year One and Pre-Master's.



International Year One

Our International Year One programmes are designed to enable entry to the second year of an undergraduate degree at the University of Lincoln. International Year One students can choose from the following subject pathways:

- Accountancy and Finance
- Business and Management
- Computer Science
- Marketing and Tourism

Pre-Sessional Courses

If you are unable to achieve our English language requirements, we may be able to offer you a place on

one of our 5-week or 10-week Pre-sessional English and Academic Study Skills (PEASS) courses.

A PEASS course can also be helpful for students who have already met the necessary requirements, but would like to learn more about the academic environment at a UK university before starting their studies.

Joining a PEASS course can help to support the development of a range of essential English and academic study skills, alongside helping you to make new friends and settle into life at university.

Pre-Master's

The University of Lincoln's Pre-Master's programme offers a route of progression onto a range of postgraduate programmes within Lincoln International Business School.

The Pre-Master's, which is taught over 12 weeks, includes core modules which focus on contemporary issues in management and strategy alongside English for academic purposes.



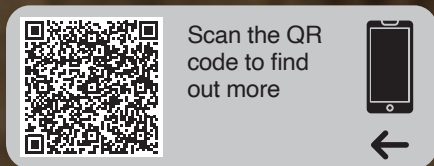

University of Lincoln Scholarships

The University of Lincoln awards a number of scholarships each year to students from around the world. Our scholarships are designed to help make education more accessible whilst also recognising achievement and potential.

International students joining a University of Lincoln undergraduate or postgraduate degree course in 2025/26 may be eligible to receive a scholarship of up to 50 per cent off tuition fees. Postgraduate taught students may also be eligible for a regional scholarship, ranging from £1,000 - £5,000*. We also offer a range of PhD studentships for students who are considering a postgraduate research programme.



Preparing to Apply to University

Studying in the UK can be a life-changing experience. It is also a big investment and you will need to take some time to think about the options available, how much it will cost, and what you will need to prepare before you apply.



To help you prepare for your studies, we've included some of the important things you will need to consider below and where to go to find out more information or advice.

Choosing a Course

The University of Lincoln offers a wide range of courses and with lots to choose from, we know it can be a challenge when deciding which one is right for you. Thinking about your career ambitions and how your studies may help you to achieve them can be a great starting point. You might also want to think about speaking with our academic staff, or with some of our students, to find out more about what it's like to study here.

Each course we offer has a dedicated page on our website. This is where you can find out more about the structure of the course, the modules that you will study,

and the assessment methods we use. Our course pages also contain information about the entrance requirements you will be expected to meet, alongside important details regarding tuition fees and study-related costs.

Creating a Budget

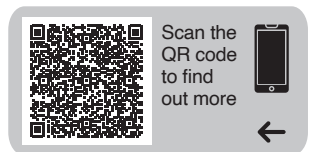
The cost of going to university in the UK might be very different to studying in your home country. To help you prepare, it's really important that you take the time to research the costs involved.

To help plan your budget, we allow students to spread their tuition fee payments across nine equal monthly instalments. Our website contains lots of helpful information on topics such as flexible payment options, tuition fees and study costs at Lincoln, and our wide range of scholarships. You can also find out more about the cost of living in Lincoln

as a student and the opportunities available for finding a part-time job.

Visas and Immigration

Most international students will need to obtain a Student visa to be able to study in the UK. There are various requirements you will need to meet to be eligible to receive a visa. This includes showing sufficient evidence that you have enough funds to cover the cost of your studies and living expenses whilst in the UK. We recommend visiting the UK Government website for the latest information regarding visa fees and eligibility requirements.



Submitting Your Application





Undergraduate Courses

If you are thinking of studying an undergraduate degree at the University of Lincoln in 2025, you will need to submit your application form through the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS).

You should aim to submit your application before the equal consideration deadline on Wednesday 29 January 2025. We may be able to accept applications after this deadline if places are still available.

Applications for the University of Nottingham's Medicine BMBS degree based in Lincoln should be submitted through UCAS by Tuesday 15 October 2024.

After you have submitted your application our Admissions Team will review the information you have provided. Once your application has been reviewed you will receive a notification from the University via the UCAS Hub. It's important to check this regularly as you may be invited to an interview or asked to provide further documents.

Postgraduate Courses

Applications for our postgraduate courses must be submitted through our online application system. To apply please visit the course page on our website and click 'apply now'.

Final-year students at the University of Lincoln are invited to use the Fast-track Postgraduate Application Form, which can be submitted through Blackboard.

Degree Preparation and Flexible Study Programmes

To apply for a place on a degree preparation programme, such as International Year One or our Pre-Master's, please visit the programme page on our website and click on 'apply now'. Applications for our flexible study programmes should also be submitted through our online application system.

What Will You Study?

We have more than 300 undergraduate and postgraduate courses to choose from. Whether you are passionate about the arts, sciences, or social sciences, we hope there is something for you at the University of Lincoln.

Studying at Lincoln

Undergraduate Study

An undergraduate degree is typically the next level of academic qualification that follows school or college in the UK, and is studied at university or another higher education provider.

A Bachelor's or Honours degree is the most common type of undergraduate degree at the University of Lincoln. Depending on the course you choose to study, you may receive awards such as a BA (Bachelor of Arts), BSc (Bachelor of Science), BEng (Bachelor of Engineering), or LLB (Bachelor of Law).

Most undergraduate degrees at the University of Lincoln take three years to complete. A number of our courses also offer a four-year integrated Master's version, allowing you to complete an additional year of study which is often focused on more advanced research skills and topics.

We offer a number of options to study a joint honours course, which allows you to study more than one subject and combine them into a single qualification.

Lincoln also offers a range of 'sandwich' courses, which are programmes that include a one-year work placement in an industry related to your course.

Subject Excellence

We are proud to be ranked in the top five in the UK across a number of subject areas within the Guardian University Guide 2025. These include:

- 1st in the UK for Animal Science and Agriculture
- 1st in the UK for Forensic Science
- 2nd in the UK for Product Design

Postgraduate Study

Choosing a Route

We offer a range of courses at Master's, MPhil, and PhD level which span a number of subject areas. The type of course that is right for you depends on several factors, including your current stage of study and your career aspirations.

Taught Courses

We offer a wide range of full-time postgraduate taught courses which normally take 12 months to complete and comprise three main stages.

The first two stages are Postgraduate Certificate and Postgraduate Diploma, and consist of a number of primarily taught modules that are individually assessed.

The third stage, the Master's level, usually consists of an individual research-based project supervised by an academic with expertise in the subject area.

Our taught courses are delivered in a variety of ways, from weekly tutorial and seminar programmes to modular study blocks of two to three days, and involve a significant amount of independent study.

Students typically learn in seminars, laboratory sessions, lectures, discussions, and debates, and assessment methods may include a written dissertation, exams, presentations, and projects.

Research Courses

Research courses offer a tailored, supervised approach and are suited to students wanting to focus on a specific area of study and make an original contribution to knowledge. These include MA/MSc by Research, which are Master's level and normally take one year full-time or two years part-time to complete, but don't usually include lectures or seminars.

An MPhil is a research degree that can be a standalone qualification, or form part of a PhD, and usually comprises a substantial piece of research that demonstrates comprehensive knowledge and critical understanding of the topic.

A PhD is a doctoral research degree that normally takes between three and four years full-time and culminates in a thesis, which must offer a significant contribution to the existing research on your subject, and should be of publishable quality.

Flexible Learning Courses

In addition to our on-campus courses, we offer a variety of flexible options, including online Master's degrees and micro credentials, on-campus short courses, and work-based learning programmes. These can be a great option if you're returning to education after a break, looking to gain additional skills, or pursuing a particular interest.
